ULTRASOUND IN PREGNANCY

Ultrasound is used to assess the developing pregnancy at 12 and 20 weeks. These examinations particularly at 20 weeks can detect many abnormalities of fetal structure particularly those that are more severe although minor defects may not be detected. The 12 week scan is performed in conjunction with Down Syndrome testing. A DVD is always provided for any pregnancy ultrasounds. 3-D /4-D ultrasound is available for all ultrasound examinations. The best images are obtained in the second half of pregnancy. As with all ultrasound imaging fetal position and maternal factors can influence the quality of these images.

GYNAECOLOGICAL ULTRASOUND

Ultrasound provides clear images of the pelvic organs and allows abnormalities in them to be detected.

VAGINAL ULTRASOUND

A vaginal scan may provide better images, particularly for gynaecological examinations and in early pregnancy. It frequently allows a diagnosis to be made which could not be made with a scan through the abdomen. The transducer is passed into the vagina like a tampon and does not disturb a pregnancy. The examination should not hurt and should cause no more discomfort than a smear test. If a vaginal scan would offer more information then you will be offered it, but you are welcome to refuse if you do not wish this type of examination.
